



Reflection has been much more favourably judged than either Simply ... Shadows (#44) or Steppin' To The Shadows (#51) — ironic, given that the only group compositions this time were embedded in the frivolous SHADOWMIX (see on #55). With the exception of the smooth-flowing (and highly imitative, though none the worse for that) rendition of Francis Lai's **BILITIS**, the title-track of the 1977 movie, it is recast chart material all the way (though six of the fourteen were themselves remakes of hits from the 1960s and 1970s).

Nonetheless, *Reflection* is indisputably of a consistently higher quality than these maligned predecessors. Quite apart from the choice of material, tonal variations in the lead instrument are exploited much more extensively, both from one number to another, and within individual numbers (SEALED WITH A KISS and CROCKETT'S THEME are notable examples of the latter).

Taking the 80's chart material in chronological order, the earliest marks a long overdue return to the group's own UK No. 12 hit of 1980. This Polydor remake is surely the best RIDERS IN THE SKY⁷⁷ of the three studio recordings: the EMI Album version (on String Of Hits) has a curiously dissonant intro and sounds forced at times; the rejigged EMI Single is livelier, but is not done any favours by the interpolation of some pretty bland "disco" effects.⁷⁸

The group had a profitable brush with The Police on *Moonlight Shadows* (#36) with EVERY BREATH YOU TAKE from 1983. This time round they took on, with equal success, an earlier piece (1981), one of the tracks drawn from the chart-topping LP *Ghost In The Machine*, the jaunty **EVERY LITTLE THING SHE DOES IS MAGIC**⁷⁹ (UK No. 1/ USA No. 3). This is a brightly-lit production, with some nifty soloing from Hank towards the close as a variation on the original's boisterous finale.

EYE OF THE TIGER, written as a theme for Sylvester Stallone's 'Rocky III' movie, with its pounding drumbeat and charged vocal delivery, took hard-rock group Survivor to the top both in the USA and the UK in 1982. The Shadows give as good as they get and better with a powerhouse version which must surely count as one of their very finest 80s covers. A magnificent opener.

The high-performing hits chosen from 1983 also furnished worthwhile instrumentals. The Shadows' version of Billy Joel's **UPTOWN GIRL** (UK No. 1/ USA No. 3) has something of the effervescence of the 60s about it — in fact the number was written by Joel as a tribute to The Four Seasons.

Giorgio Moroder composed the music (as opposed to the lyrics) for **FLASHDANCE** ... **WHAT A FEELING**, for the 1983 movie 'Flashdance', which vocalist Irene Cara took to Number Two in the UK and Number One in the USA. In true Moroder fashion, a subdued intro gives way to an explosive main theme — as with EYE OF THE TIGER, so with this The Shadows are true to the dynamism of the original — after the 3m mark we are almost back in the era of The Hank Marvin Guitar Syndicate at their most high-powered.

Presumably YOU'LL NEVER WALK ALONE was picked up by the marketing people at Polydor because it had been a UK chart-topper in 1985 for the charity venture by The Crowd, with Gerry Marsden as lead vocalist. This Rodgers and Hammerstein song from the show 'Carousel' had of course enjoyed (and would go on to enjoy) star treatment, with memorable versions from Gerry and The Pacemakers and from Elvis Presley, not to mention supporters of Liverpool FC. The Shadows though play it distinctly cool —

too cool in fact — and do not go in for the uplifting approach. One of the less appealing numbers in this set.

1987 brought material for three tracks on *Reflection*: **CROCKETT'S THEME**, one of Czech keyboard player Jan Hammer's contributions to the TV series 'Miami Vice', was a UK Number Two. The Shadows really attack this one with relish: in their hands it is appropriately mean-sounding and has terrific clout, making Hammer sound almost insipid in comparison, particularly in the first half.

Hank Marvin surpasses himself on **NOTHING'S GONNA STOP US NOW**, such is his inventiveness and dexterity. He is off to a flying start admittedly with material of this calibre, a superb power ballad from Starship (UK No. 1/USA No. 1), featured in the movie 'Mannequin'.

The impression created by the cover of **ALWAYS ON MY MIND** is quite different. Here is a version clearly founded on that of The Pet Shop Boys (UK No. 1 [1987] / USA No. 4 [1988]) rather than on the Elvis rendition: great tune, great guitar sound, shame about the hurdy-gurdy accompaniment⁸⁰ — so unadventurous and uninspired when set against that awesome hit Single, which possesses an almost symphonic dimension.

From 1989, four numbers come into the picture. Chicago-born Richard Marx has enjoyed more success in his home country than in this, but his piano-led ballad **RIGHT HERE WAITING** fared exceptionally well, reaching No. 1 in the USA and No. 2 in the UK. A superb melody, beautifully handled by Hank. —Ditto for another UK No. 2, Michael Ball's **LOVE CHANGES EVERYTHING**, from the Andrew Lloyd Webber musical 'Aspects Of Love'.

Finally here, two UK chart-toppers, both of them remakes: the much-covered **SEALED WITH A KISS** referred to earlier in this survey, from Pete Waterman protégé Jason Donovan; and **SOMETHING'S GOTTEN HOLD OF MY HEART**, from Marc Almond and Gene Pitney: shorn of the outrageous histrionics, this latter works well as an instrumental, with the ringing Marvin guitar given plenty of room to breathe.

Enough of the UK population were taken with Candy Flip's funky electronic update of **STRAWBERRY FIELDS FOREVER** to lift it to Number Three by the last day of March 1990. Presumably it was this renewed interest that prompted its inclusion on *Reflection*. Or maybe not. Certainly there is nothing in The Shadows' version that approximates to Candy Flip's meanderings. Theirs is a big, bold, sweeping production, which recreates some of the rich textures of the original masterpiece; but the overall effect is too upbeat (in contrast to the ever so sombre outro) — the addition of a cellist or two would have served to darken the tone.⁸¹

With *Reflection* then, their very last Album of fresh material, the group came up trumps.

The recording sessions for Polydor product were so focused that there was nothing to spare — there would be no more treasures belatedly seeing the light of day. Since 1990, apart from a rogue DANCING IN THE DARK (see #91), only a live Album (#93) has been added to the tally, and even that was already accessible to the public via alternative channels.

No room was found, naturally enough, for group compositions.




The 48 tracks in question were sourced as follows:

As remarked in *CD Guide* 265, there is a nearly complete run of B-Singles from FENDER BENDER in 1980 to ARTY'S PARTY in 1989; nearly complete, because JOHNNY STACCATO was arbitrarily reduced from 3m 50s to 2m 31s, and there is no 7" version of DANCING IN THE DARK, which was an A-side (#37), but also *listed* as one of two supporting tracks on a 12" Single, though in the event the Album version was incorporated instead! See on #38 for details.

A-sides were thinner on the ground, as one would expect with a licenced collection at a budget price: MOZART FORTE, TELSTAR, IMAGINE: WOMAN, THEME FROM MISSING, DIAMONDS, MOUNTAINS OF THE MOON.

A must for completists, naturally, but the holding over of the individual issue *Dancing In The Dark* did induce some less avid collectors to lash out prematurely on the box, so acquiring two copies of the first two releases in the process (and ending up in many cases with five nasty brown discs, see on #57).



The third 16-track Pickwick CD (no vinyl equivalent this time round) to offer selections from The Shadows' Polydor output (see #57, 60) drew on LP material from 1980 through to 1989, the compiler obviously having been given a fair degree of latitude: one track from *Change Of Address* (= A), two from *Hits Right Up Your Street* (B), four from *Life In The Jungle* (C), three from *The Silver Album/ XXV* (D), one from *Guardian Angel* (E), one from *Moonlight Shadows* (F), two from *Steppin' To The Shadows* (G), together with a couple of B-sides from 1982/83 (H: #12, #18). Of these, OUTDIGO from *Change Of Address* and the B-sides were new to CD.

Eight original compositions were included, making this the most varied and adventurous of the three Pickwick compilations (cf. Alan Taylor, *Pipeline* 8 [1991] 17).

This single CD had been marketed as part of a 3CD Box Set, see on #62 for an overview.

With no more fresh Albums to come, Polydor started to recycle the fruits of the previous decade. This 16-track Album takes in material from eight different sources: two tracks from *Change Of Address* (A), two from *Hits Right Up Your Street* (B), three from *The Silver Album/XXV* (C), three from *Moonlight Shadows* (D), two from *Simply ... Shadows* (E), two from *Steppin' To The Shadows* (F), one from *The Shadows At Their Very Best* (G), one from *Reflection* (H).

On the whole (as the title suggests), this is The Shadows in relaxed, "easy-listening" mode, though some livelier moments are provided by memories of Jan Hammer, Toto, Sting, The Bee Gees and Mike Oldfield. Polydor's marketing instincts proved sound: this collection of chart-related cover versions, every one of them previously released, almost made the Top Twenty.

Hits Right Up Your Street is thus the main source of supply: in fact, the twelve tracks on this set represent all the cover versions on that Album, the four originals not coming into the picture. It is essentially the same with The Silver Album: nine of the ten novel tracks on that reappear here, the tenth, a group-penned number (SHADOOGIE '83) being set aside.

The 6 CDs (as so often with RD products) are themed, rather untidily and not always aptly: details in *CD Guide* 102. There is a booklet with several pages of annotation, the author of which, amazingly, is not identified.
