First, find the music-carriers. It is probably better not to rummage through the hinged flaps of this standard 2CD-sized box before looking at the leaflet provided: this offers an elaborate diagram

illustrating the whereabouts of the five discs. Next, put the contailer on a flat surface: the flexure in the trays is such that a disc could easily be damaged if removed in a hurry. What about the music itself? Page 17 0f the 28-page booklet (nearly all of the text by Rob Finnis concerns Cliff rather than The Shads) expresses the belief that this compilation is "the most comprehensive and satisfying yet to be packaged on compact disc, an invaluable historical document ..." Hmm.

In fact, what we have is a pretty haphazard assortment, not especially well organised: Cliff's No.1 hits in one bit, more chart toppers in another; Shads hits here, more Shads hits somewhere else; *Let Me Be The One* lurking in a batch of Cliff's 'Love Songs'. No selection devoted to his rock output should pass over the album 'Me And My Shadows'. Is the minor hit *When Blue Turns To Grey* really a "Cliff Classic"? Is *The War Lord* the best representative of The Shadows At The Movies? Chronology seems not to matter either. And it is time in my opinion that Cliff compilers got their act together. All too often murky mono tracks are used when perfectly good stereo versions are available: there are too many of the former in the present collection.

So, is there anything out of the ordinary? Well, this is the only UK CD, I believe, that offers Cliff's *True True Lovin'* (also on 'Wonderful Cliff', Fremus CDFR 0564, Italy 1994). It is also the only CD to offer a comical *Las Tres Carabelas*: what on earth have they done to the sound balance on this one?
