

Little is known of this issue, which appears as a simple listing on one of Dolton's websites. For Canada, The Ventures were otherwise in singles rather than EP territory, initially on the Reo label for Walk, Don't Run/ Home in 1960, then over to London for Perfidia/ No Trespassing and Ram Bunk-Shush/ Lonely Heart, with Dolton and subsequently Liberty taking control for the rest of the 60s.

Of the 21 EPs drawing on nine of the twelve tracks (1) from the 1961 album *The Ventures*, only 03 and 63a takes all four numbers from this source. Tracks 1-2: also 07; 1+3: 02-04, 08, 26, 41, 63a, 74, 139.

# FRANCE 02

Perfidia London RE-G 10.075 Perfidia/ No Trespassing/ Ram-Bunk-Shush/ Lonely Heart



A handsomely presented EP, more so than the 1962 follow-up (13) with its wholly derivative front cover. The French record industry was to thrive on EPs: the two Ventures releases for this year and the next may serve to demonstrate how The Shadows were the overwhelmingly dominant force in their field. Over the course of 1961/1962 France saw the release of no fewer than five EPs, not to mention the fourteen singles that emerged in rapid succession.

### NETHERLANDS 03

Unusually, a Ventures EP as one of a series, Tiener Toppers (Teen Smash Hits), in such distinguished company as Bill Black's Combo, Duane Eddy, Del Shannon and Johnny And The Hurricanes. For the first and third tracks see next entry, and on **01**. London were clearly working with a limited selection of numbers across these early EPs. Both Torquay and the exhilarating Ups'n Downs from *The Ventures* 1961 appear also in **11** and **63a**, both of them rarities: Mexico's Expo Seven-0 (**196**, 1970) has the updated version of Torquay from the album *More Golden Greats* (>**187**). On the tracks 1+3 together see on **01**.







# PORTUGAL 04

The Ventures London International LES 544
Perfidia/ No Trespassing/ Ram-Bunk-Shush/ Lonely Heart



A solitary Ventures EP release from Portugal. It shares the same tracks with France's *Perfidia* (**02**) and three of its four tracks with Sweden's *The Ventures* (**08**). These three in particular are immensely appealing numbers and were obvious contenders for speedy inclusion on EP in the wake of Dolton's release of the singles Perfidia/ No Trespassing in 1960 and Ram-Bunk-Shush/ Lonely Heart in the year following. Further track combinations: 1-2: **10**; 1+3: see on **01**; 3-4: **07**, **11**.

#### Front cover group photo:

A run of London releases in 1961 (**04** Portugal above, **06/07** Spain, **10** UK; in reduced form **02** France), while manufactured in their respective countries each with their own distinctive record labels, share the same group photo (**1**), presumably sent by Dolton to London for distribution to the respective markets. Compare these two singles from Denmark:





Tracks from two 1961 Dolton albums, 1-2 from the June Another Smash!!!, 3-4 from the September The Colorful Ventures (see on 21/22). So the choice of front cover design from the former was a reasonable one in principle, but it is as unpalatable and inept here as it was on the original. Bob Bogle on the other hand voiced his admiration, regarding it as comical (1974 interview in New Gandy Dancer 15.5). Halterman (62) makes the point that "The picture was right in line with Liberty's current string of violence-laden trade magazine ads", and gives two vivid illustrations of that from Billboard. One may add that the practice was by no means confined to Liberty product. Dolton switched speedily, in September, to a wholly different design (though hardly an inspiring one, see pic), and Japan in due course followed suit, but Mark 1 did persist in the early sixties (Dolton: Canada; London: UK and Australia) and with reissues well beyond. It was taken up by London for UK EP release in 1962 (21).

Pride of place here goes to the highly popular String-A-Longs' Wheels (also **38** Hong Kong): it performed well in the US and UK, was a chart-topper in Belgium, Germany and the Netherlands, and attained hit single status in South Africa itself (on the London label, PD.7-8406).

See on 22. Lady Of Spain is closely associated with the preceding Blue Moon in the singles (1) sphere (its history is somewhat involved: C/B 63-64/61.18-19, 74/61.25, 115/62.26), but its inclusion here in a collection specifically termed Colorful is curious at best. Tracks 1,4: also 67; 3-4: 13.

A wholly satisfying selection on the UK's first Ventures EP, the two hit singles provided with excellent support with No Trespassing and (also **120**; **51** is the updated version, see C/B 193/64.16-17) Night Train, a relative rarity in the 60s (LP *The Ventures* Japan, cf. above **08**, LP *The Ventures Again*, Germany/ Netherlands 1963). 

A rarity: a US Ventures EP, almost as rare as the cheerful creature reinforcing the recommendation of the title. For the same design see **26**, **41**, **139**. A diverting enough collection of tracks drawn from the late 1960 debut album *Walk*, *Don't Run*. Identical track-listing on a Spanish EP, **06** above. Walk, Don't Run would go on to occupy a number of EPs, though its dominance would be blunted by the arrival on the scene of the fresh version in 1964. The remaining numbers are not frequent (> **06**; Raunchy in **187** is the updated version, C/B 377/69.8). Tracks 1-2 are found together in **13**, tracks 2-3 in **81**.


